

MAINE TOWNSHIP COVID-19 MASK POLICY UPDATED MAY 18, 2021

Per guidance by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and in accordance with the [updated Executive Order](#) released by Governor Pritzker on May 17, individuals who have been **fully vaccinated against COVID-19** are no longer required to wear a face covering in Maine Township facilities or while participating in programs (both indoors and outdoors).

Individuals who are over the age of two, **but not fully vaccinated**, and able to medically tolerate a face covering are required to cover their nose and mouth with a face covering when in a public place and unable to maintain a six-foot social distance.

Since the start of the pandemic, the Maine Township has followed the guidelines from the [Illinois Department of Public Health](#) and the [DCEO Restore Illinois Plan](#) in order to safely operate our programs and facilities.

The Township will continue to follow State guidelines by:

- Requiring face coverings and social distancing for **individuals not fully vaccinated**.
- **Following capacity limits** as outlined by the [Bridge to Phase 5 Restore Illinois](#) guidelines.

We appreciate your adherence to these State guidelines and we look forward to reaching Phase 5 of the Restore Illinois Plan.
